IB SA Tier II Syllabus 2025: Descriptive Paper (Translation)

Tier II is designed to test the candidate's translation skills between English and the local language/dialect. This paper is descriptive in nature and qualifying in the selection process. Candidates will be asked to translate a 500-word passage from the local language to English and vice versa. The focus is on language proficiency, grammar accuracy, and understanding of both languages.

IB Security Assistant Tier III – Interview

The Tier III round is the final stage of the selection process for the IB Security Assistant post. It consists of a personal interview or personality test, where candidates are assessed on their suitability for the role, presence of mind, communication skills, general awareness, and overall personality. This stage holds significant weight in determining the final merit list. Only candidates who clear Tier I and Tier III will be eligible for selection. Final selection is subject to document verification and medical fitness.

What is IB SA Final Merit List Criteria 2025?

The selection process for the IB SA post includes three tiers: Tier-I (Objective Test), Tier-II (Skill Test), and Tier-III (Interview/Personality Test). Candidates must meet minimum cut-off marks at each stage to proceed to the next round. Final selection is based on combined performance in Tier-I and Tier-III.

Stage	Details
Tier-I	Objective type exam. Cut-off: UR-30, OBC-28, SC/ST-25, EWS-30 (out of 100).
Shortlisting for Tier-II	10 times the number of vacancies based on Tier-I normalized scores and cut-off criteria.
Tier-II	Qualifying nature. Minimum qualifying marks: 20 out of 50.
Shortlisting for Tier-III	5 times the number of vacancies based on Tier-I scores, subject to qualifying Tier-II marks.
Tier-III	Interview/Personality test. Final merit list based on Tier-I and Tier-III performance.
Waiting List	Will be prepared for future replacements as per DoP&T guidelines dated 13.06.2000.
